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Supply List – Lizzie's Quilt 88" X 106"



Finished size 88" x 106"

Each quilter will need (1) Lizzie's Quilt pattern by Reproduction Quilts -- available in class for \$14.00

Class Description

Lizzie's Quilt is a reproduction of strippy quilt that travelled with the Calico and Chintz exhibit early in this century. When I saw it at the Speed Museum in Louisville, I was fascinated with its odd block sizes. Why would a quilter make 7" Nine Patch blocks and Album blocks that finish at 10.5"? Lizzie Jones of New Jersey obviously had a very analytical mind when she pieced this quilt in 1843! The variety of pieced blocks, set on point, combine to make an 88" X 106" quilt. This quilt would have been used horizontally on a bed -- its wide width allowing a long drop to keep the several occupants of the bed warm. We'll have lots of fun playing with a wide variety of fabric options and using 21st century techniques as you reproduce this 19th century quilt!

Supply List

Basic sewing equipment including straight stitch sewing machine, rotary cutter tools (mat, cutter, rulers), pins, scissors. Optional but VERY helpful – Easy Angle and Companion Angle by EzQuilting. Limited supply available for sale in class.

Fabric: For class, please bring an assortment of small amounts of fabrics (1/4 yard each or less) that are appropriate for making this quilt. These may include toiles, chintzes, woodblocks, ramoneurs, pale double pinks, turkey reds, Prussian blues, chrome yellows, cheddar oranges, and poison greens. If you don't know these terms -- don't worry. Bring your favorite reproduction fabrics and we'll identify them in class.
